AFL requests expedited processing of this request. In support thereof, AFL certifies its compelling need for expedited processing under 5 U.S.C. § 552(a)(6)(E) and 28 C.F.R. § 16.5(e), which provides in relevant part:

*(e) Expedited processing. (1) Requests and appeals shall be processed on an expedited basis whenever it is determined that they involve... (ii) An urgency to inform the public about an actual or alleged Federal Government activity, if made by a person who is primarily engaged in disseminating information; or (iv) A matter of widespread and exceptional media interest in which there exist possible questions about the government's integrity that affect public confidence.*

As many federal agencies have acknowledged in granting AFL expedited processing, AFL is primarily engaged in disseminating information to the public. Additionally, there is an urgency to inform the public regarding the circumstances surrounding not only the federal government's recent execution of a search warrant on a former President, but also the use of federal law enforcement tools generally. These are matters of pressing national importance.

The FBI recently raided the home of the former President of the United States in a time when the FBI has come under increased scrutiny for applying two standards of justice, one to the political left and associates of the current president and a different standard to the former president. This is an issue of immense public concern, debate, and the constitutional rights of millions of Americans hang in the balance, along with the FBI's credibility as an institution of justice. Providing these calendars in a timely fashion will help inform the debate around what happened yesterday, and why.

#### **IV. Agreement to Pay**

AFL requests a fee waiver for its request and has reviewed the FOIA reference guide. If our fee waiver is denied, please limit this request to the two free hours of searching and 100 duplicated pages.

As a nonprofit organization, AFL does not have a commercial purpose and the release of the information requested is not in AFL's financial interest. Accordingly, AFL has been granted fee waivers on this basis by the Departments of Defense, Education, Energy, Health and Human Services, Justice, Interior, and Homeland Security, and the Office of the Director of National Intelligence. The reported execution of a search warrant by the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) against a former President of the United States is unprecedented. It has been reported that the White House was unaware that a former President’s residence was being raided by the FBI. Further, it is reported that this raid was in relation to an ongoing discussion between the National Archives and Records Administration and President Trump over ensuring all presidential records are properly archived. This request seeks to
